## Vulcan Lawsuit Update

The City of Duarte's lawsuit against the City of Azusa and Vulcan Materials, seeking to overturn Vulcan's entitlements for its mining expansion project due to the Azusa City Council's Brown Act violations, as well as seeking to overturn Azusa's certification of the Final Environment Impact Report for the expansion project, is moving forward.

Many steps are being taken simultaneously by Duarte's legal team to keep the process advancing through the court system. Specifically, Duarte's attorneys are currently awaiting documents from the City of Azusa so Duarte can prepare the "Administrative Record" for the case. The Administrative Record, which the court will review, consists of all of the documents that were before the Azusa Planning Commission and Azusa City Council on the Vulcan matter when those two entities took their action.

Attorneys for the two cities will also be meeting in a "CEQA settlement conference" which is required by the California Environmental Quality Act. Duarte remains hopeful that Azusa will come to that meeting ready to acknowledge the deficiencies in the Vulcan EIR and agree to prepare a document that both meets CEQA requirements and saves Van Tassel Ridge. Finally, the assigned judge to the case also has scheduled a status conference on the lawsuit for mid-November to be attended by attorneys for the two cities. At that time, the judge may establish a schedule for Duarte and Azusa to submit legal briefs on the matter. Duarte does not anticipate, however, that there will be an actual court hearing on the case until early 2011.

In its current form, the Vulcan mining expansion project is poised to destroy Van Tassel Ridge as Vulcan plans to extract 105.6 million tons of aggregate from the mountain between now and 2038. Over that same period, the City of Azusa stands to make more than \$65 million in mining fees and incentives from Vulcan at the expense of its neighbors in Duarte. ## Property Owners Vote on Special Neighborhood Landscape Maintenance Zones Assessment

In June of this year, four of Duarte's neighborhood landscape maintenance zones had the opportunity to cast votes to determine whether or not to increase the monthly assessment for landscape maintenance. The neighborhoods were: Encanto Parkway, Rancho Verde, Windsor Village, and Kendrick Tract. There are 13 other special neighborhood zones in the City that did not vote this year because the current assessment covers the cost of maintenance.

These special neighborhood zones were developed to pay for the maintenance of the common landscaping that is unique to each zone. The annual assessment in each zone covers costs for water, electricity, landscape maintenance, irrigation repairs and replacements, landscape replacements, upgrades, and administration.

The Windsor Village residents chose to increase the annual assessment and maintain the existing level of maintenance service. Three of these neighborhoods, Encanto Parkway, Rancho Verde, and Kendrick Tract, chose a reduction in the level of service in lieu of an increase in assessment.

### The following maintenance reductions will occur over the coming months:

**Encanto Parkway:** The main service reduction in this area will be the removal of turf along Encanto Parkway between the Avila Gardens Senior Facility and Encanto Park along the west side of the road. The turf area will be maintained as needed to keep weeds down and irrigation will be significantly reduced. Over time as funds permit, the turf will be removed and replaced with mulch. The long-term program will include replanting with drought tolerant landscape.

**Rancho Verde:** The Rancho Verde area includes properties on Hacienda Drive, San Pablo Drive, San Pablo Way, San Juan Circle, and Bernardo Circle that have front yard areas maintained by the assessment district. Much of the landscape maintenance in these areas involves irrigation and shrub maintenance. Since the only possible reduction in this area is reduced pruning frequency, a combination of shrub removal and significant pruning will occur in the next three months. Shrubs that need regular pruning and are located close to driveways and sidewalks will be removed.

**Kendrick Tract:** This area involves landscape along Las Lomas Road and Vineyard Avenue north of Royal Oaks Drive. In this area, much of the maintenance responsibility involves shrub pruning. Pruning frequency will be reduced, and only pruning necessary to maintain public safety will be performed. Shrubs that need regular pruning and are located close to sidewalks will be removed.

From the above table, only Zone 8, Windsor Village, approved the proposed assessment increase. As a result, Windsor Village will not see a reduction in the landscape services that they have been receiving. For Zones 5, 6, and 9, the proposed assessment increase did not pass. Subsequently, the City has renegotiated the landscape contract and/or reduced the utility usage for these zones to a level where the assessment collected is paying for 100% of the services provided.

## Duarte's 15th Annual Route 66 Parade

Duarte's 15th annual Salute to Route 66 Parade and 53rd Anniversary City Picnic on Sept. 18 will be a celebration of youth with 14 year-old mountain climbing adventurer Jordan Romero leading the way as the parade's grand marshal. The parade will also welcome home our veterans from the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts, plus feature "Community Grand Marshal" Edward Houlemarde. In addition, to honor KTLA veteran broadcaster Stan Chambers on the occasion of his retirement, the City of Duarte also proclaimed this year's parade as "Stan Chambers Day in Duarte."

This year's parade themed "Rockin' & Rollin' Down Route 66" will step off at 10 a.m. at the northeast corner of Huntington Dr. and Cotter St. and proceed east one mile along Duarte's historic Route 66.

In all, the parade will feature more than 1,000 kids of all ages from Duarte and neighboring communities representing schools, churches, and a variety of sports and recreation programs. It will also spotlight ten high school marching bands and dozens of antique and

classic cars, equestrian units, and specialty entries with participants coming from throughout Southern California.

Immediately following the parade, the public is invited to attend the City picnic at Royal Oaks Park celebrating Duarte's 53rd anniversary of incorporation from 12 noon to 4 p.m. Festivities


surrounding the picnic include both Classic Car Show and Arts and Crafts

## Halloween Safety Tips

As families and kids begin to plan for this popular holiday, keep in mind the following guidelines for a safe Halloween:

### Costumes and Accessories:

- Choose flame-retardant costumes and review the principle of "Stop-Drop-Roll" with your children.
- To prevent falling, avoid long, baggy costumes or oversized shoes.
- Avoid hats and masks.
- Have your children wear light colors or reflective tape on their costumes.
- Have your child's name and address inside his/her costume.
- Avoid selecting costumes with fake weapons.
- Costumes should be flexible, not rigid or sharp.

### Trick or Treat:

- Kids need to know not to eat their treats until they get home. Eat only unopened candies in original wrappers. Always inspect fruit and homemade goodies.
- Trick-or-treaters should be in groups and/or accompanied by adults. Make sure all children know their addresses and phone numbers in case they get separated.
- Map out a safe route to know where your children will be going and agree on an established return time. Stop only at familiar homes. Never enter a stranger's car/house.
- Walk on sidewalks. If a street has no sidewalks, children should walk on the left side of the street facing traffic. Avoid walking through alleys.
- Cross at crosswalks (not between parked cars) and stay together.
- Carry a flashlight with fresh batteries, wear a watch and carry a cell phone or coins to make telephone calls.
- Remind your children to call 911 for help if they get lost or (626) 448-9861 if calling from a cell phone.
- Do not pet unfamiliar animals.
- When driving, drive slowly and watch for children when exiting driveways and turning onto streets.




## Duarte Youth Sports
