

- The City of Duarte, in partnership with the City of Hope CCARE, presented the annual Summer Health Camps. This immensely successful program allows parents of children 6-11 years of age to enroll at the very low price of \$20 to participate in a weeklong health and nutrition-focused camp.
- In 2016, both Smart & Final Extra and Grocery Outlet opened for business ending a short period where the City did not have a formal supermarket.
- Two types of bike lanes have been installed: Class II, which provides cyclist a delineated bike lane adjacent to the sidewalk; and Class III, which includes signage along the sidewalk and bicycle markings in the vehicle lane. Commissioner Edwards announced that Relay For Life will conduct a bike fundraiser event that will be located along the Emerald Necklace bike path area by the City of Hope.

C. Upcoming Staff Training and CPR/First Aid

Monsalve provided the Commissioners with a staff memo announcing the upcoming staff training days on June 8 and 9 from 5:15-7:15 p.m. Training will include Bloodborne Pathogens training and part-time employee recognition. Commissioners are invited to attend. CPR/First Aid training will be held Wednesday, May 17 at 5:15 p.m.

D. Upcoming Registration for Summer Programs

Monsalve presented the Commissioners with the new Summer Fun brochure. Registration begins on May 22 and program highlights include:

- Concerts in the Park every Wednesday in July and first Wednesday in August at 6:30 p.m.
- Several camps are being offered including a new Teen travel camp, Discovery Nature camp, Summer Health camps, and Adventure Club trip camps.
- Several events will take place throughout the summer for children 5-12 years of age.
- Online registration for summer swim lessons will be offered for the first time after a successful spring registration period.
