



CITY OF DUARTE TO UPDATE HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

The City of Duarte is pleased to announce the planning process to update the City's Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan is required to maintain eligibility for certain funding opportunities prior to and following a major disaster. The plan is required to be updated every five years. The plan identified a long list of hazards including earthquake, wildfire, landslide, flood, dam failure, windstorm, and hazardous materials event. The first task of the plan update will be to reassess the threats and impacts associated with these hazards. Plotting out the location of these hazards is important as critical facilities are considered and mitigation action items developed to minimize or eliminate threats associated with the hazards. Also, the capability assessment from the plan will be updated to identify new resources and staffing capabilities. Once initial information and updates have been gathered by the City's consultant, a Planning Team will be formed with representatives from City departments responsible for maintaining public facilities and regulating development.

In 2023, FEMA updated its regulations relating to the preparation of local hazard mitigation plan. The new regulations added four areas of focus: 1) climate change impacts on hazards, 2) analysis and location of socially vulnerable populations, 3) hazard-specific impacts on socially vulnerable populations, and 4) a more robust community outreach strategy to inform and engage the public and stakeholders.

To respond to the new requirement regarding identification and outreach to socially vulnerable populations, the Planning Team will utilize an online tool from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to identify location and ranking of the community's socially vulnerable population. The CDC has identified 16 social attributes that are used to determine percentages of social vulnerability. The CDC's Socially Vulnerable Index was designed to help emergency managers identify and map communities that will most likely need support before, during, and after a disaster. The graphic below depicts the 16 social attributes for social vulnerability:

This school year, Ray Abernathy returns as a full-time consultant for the Public Safety Youth Programs, providing comprehensive support to youth and families across all Duarte schools. With 23 years of experience as a Los Angeles Deputy Probation Officer, including a decade in juvenile prevention and intervention in the City of Duarte,

Abernathy brings a wealth of expertise to this role. Over the past decade, he played a crucial role in launching the A-Team, a program serving hundreds of Duarte youth. His work spans all Duarte schools, the Teen Center, the Boxing Gym, the Boys and Girls Club, and Pamela Park.

An independent evaluation by Azusa Pacific University confirmed the program's effectiveness and secured multiple rounds of grant funding from the State of California, highlighting its positive impact on the youth and the broader community. Known affectionately as "Mr. A" by the youth and schools, Abernathy has made significant strides in improving school performance, attendance, attitude, behavior at home and school, and relationships with family and peers through group mentoring and case management. Notably, juvenile arrests declined by 97% over the 10-year period.

Abernathy's dedication has earned him numerous accolades, including the Golden Apple from the Duarte Unified School District in 2018, the Community Hero Award from the Regional Chamber of Commerce in the San Gabriel Valley in 2019, and the Distinguished Service Award from the Kiwanis Club of Duarte in 2017-2018. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Cal State LA and a Master's in Education from American Intercontinental University, and has served as an adjunct professor at Everest College.

Ray Abernathy remains committed to providing comprehensive intervention and support services to foster personal growth, academic success, and overall well-being among youth. Utilizing his extensive background in juvenile probation and community intervention, Abernathy focuses on promoting behavioral health, well-being, and positive community engagement. His role includes juvenile case management, psycho-social assessment, student advocacy, and instruction on core values and ethics through group mentoring and individualized case management. Each month, Abernathy will serve hundreds of youth from grades 1 through 12, addressing various challenges and promoting positive outcomes in collaboration with stakeholders.


PUBLIC SAFETY MID-YEAR REVIEW NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH UPDATE

The mid-year report shows that crime rates have remained steady compared to last year. However, a five-year snapshot reveals a significant drop in crime compared to 2021 and 2022. The most notable decrease was in Assault and Robbery, which together dropped by over 37.47%. Unfortunately, there was an increase in auto thefts, with 11 more incidents recorded compared to last year. Despite saturation operations by Sergeant Fiedler and the Special Assignment Team, we still need the public's assistance.

Director of Public Safety Larry Breceda comments, "We are having a great year. I want to congratulate the Public Safety Sub-Station team, especially Sergeant Fiedler and the Deputies and, of course, our residents, that were proactive in crime prevention. However, we need to continue the good work." said Larry Breceda, Director of Public Safety. "Residents can further this trend by installing anti-theft devices on their vehicles, as Grand Theft Auto remains a significant issue. Additionally, reporting any suspicious activity to Temple Station helps our deputies take proactive measures to ensure safety." If you see a crime in progress or feel unsafe, call 9-1-1.

- · Park in well-lit, heavily populated areas
